The roofers were scheduled to replace the roof at the end of April, but they had an available opening and the work was completed early. The energetic crew ripped off old shingles and stapled on new ones during a two day period. Members of the Property Committee cleared the sanctuary and covered the pews with plastic so they would be kept clean from falling dirt and debris. Thank you to everyone who worked so hard to complete this large task in a timely manner.





I need Easter this year. It's been a long Lent, and spiritual shadows have appeared as we've adjusted to living with COVID-19. The normal cheery interchanges that we have with our neighbors have seemed muted as we dance at a distance from people whose company we enjoy. Concerns about how to maintain physical health and spiritual connections among our church members have been very present in my thought processes. The inability to gather physically and worship God with you has created a hunger in my heart for your company. As I've talked with you on the telephone and during video conference calls, I've discovered that many of us share this hunger.

The circumstances that we face currently appear to have spiritual commonalities with the disciples who walked with Jesus in the first century. When Jesus was arrested, most of the disciples isolated themselves. Public exposure could result in their deaths. They were uncertain how to live their faith and what form that faith would take in their changing circumstances. And then, Easter arrived. Mary Magdalene and other believers ventured forth in the darkness and found that death could not cancel the love of Christ. Jesus had risen, his spirit was alive, and the Good News spread throughout Jerusalem.

As time passed, the gospel reached other continents, and Christian practices evolved to meet the needs of the people who it encountered. The message of God's amazing and saving grace remained the same, but the methods used to communicate the gospel changed. I doubt that the first century disciples would have imagined that their words would be broadcast on television some day by evangelists such as Billy Graham.

The presence of the pandemic means that we are finding new ways to be the church and share the gospel. Emails, social media, video conference calls, online devotional services, and Drive-In Church (see the next page) can help us to remain connected in Christ when our standard worship habits change. Our General Minister and President, The Reverend Teresa Hord Owens, communicates that even though we are practicing social distancing, we do not have to be in social isolation. We can reach out to each other through the telephone, cards, and electronic means.

And, like the first century disciples, we will discover that Easter has come. COVID-19 cannot cancel the love of Christ.

COMING ON EASTER: DRIVE-IN CHURCH! COME AS YOU ARE AND STAY IN YOUR CAR!

Beginning Easter, April 12, Glen Echo Christian Church will host "Drive-In Church." Park in the church's south or east parking lot by 10:15 and listen to our worship service on your car's FM radio! Bulletins (with song lyrics) will be posted on our website and emailed to the congregation ahead of time. People who don't have computers will receive the bulletins by mail.

During the service, Patty will play and Pastor Dawn will lead the other portions of worship, including a Children's Message. We will celebrate communion with bread & juice that each person brings from home. An offering will be collected in a unique and safe way, and we will have an opportunity to enact the words, "Honk If You Love Jesus."

Drive-In Church will continue each Sunday morning until we can gather safely in the sanctuary (unless a "Shelter in Place Order" is issued). If the weather is nice and people sit six feet apart, they are welcome to bring chairs and portable radios and sit on the front lawn.

Join us as we explore this method of coming together to worship God!

ENCOURAGING ECHOES

Another way to remain connected as a congregation during this time of social distancing is to become part of the newly established Wednesday evening "Encouraging Echoes." Each Wednesday night at 7:30, Pastor Dawn will host an online video conference through the free technology program, "Zoom." Interested participants need to notify the Pastor ahead of time that they would like to be part of the conversation, and Pastor Dawn will email an invitation to them. On the night of the event, participants will click on the link that is embedded in the invitation, and they will be connected to the video conference.

Ten people participated in the first video meeting on March 25. Even with initial technical difficulties that were resolved, folks enjoyed seeing and listening to each other as personal updates, thoughts about faith, and communion were shared. The experience was a positive one, and several requests were made to have this become a recurring event. These video meetings will continue until we can worship in the sanctuary.



PRAYER VIGIL

The Good Friday Prayer Vigil is April 10, from 6:00 AM to midnight. This year, folks are encouraged to pray at home, but they can also pray at Glen Echo.
