




MINISTER'S MOMENT



"And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road." (Matthew 2:12)

We are told in Matthew 2:12 that after the Wise Men followed the Bethlehem star and found Jesus, they returned to their own country by a different route than the one that they'd used to find the Baby King. The reason why they changed their path and their plans was for the sake of safety. King Herod was incensed to learn that a child had been born who he perceived would threaten his ruling practices, and he planned to kill the Holy Child after the Magi revealed the baby's location. God warned the Wise Ones through a dream that it was not safe to return home via the same road, so they found another way.

Sometimes, paths and plans change for the sake of safety, even if the changes are unfamiliar and seem inconvenient. Methods that we've always used and practiced may not lead to the best outcomes as circumstances develop. In situations such as these, we can learn from the example of the Magi. They followed God's guidance and found Jesus, and they followed God's guidance and returned safely home.

God has guided Glen Echo during the pandemic, leading us to find fresh ways to worship (online services, Drive-In Church) and fellowship (Encouraging Echoes, Thanksgiving dinner). Outreach has discovered new methods to minister to God's children (books for school children, a donation to Bogota Kids), and they have continued beloved projects (Salvation Army casseroles, Mitten Tree). And through God's grace and your generosity, we are entering 2022 in a solid financial position.

In January 2022, we will have an opportunity to continue to seek God's direction during a half-day retreat on Saturday morning, January 15th. (See page three.) We will pray, read scripture, and listen to God and one another as we discern together how the Holy One wants to guide us in the new year. We will have the chance to still the cacophony of our personal drives and druthers and seek the will and wisdom of our Creator — who led the Wise Ones on their quest to find the embodiment of God's love, Jesus.

Our beloved Creator has not lost the will to impart wisdom to us. I'm looking forward to listening and following where God leads.


