A service for Maundy Thursday, April 1st, will be uploaded to YouTube.


Please call the church office to sign up to pray for an hour (at home) on Good Friday, April 2nd, between 6 AM & midnight.

REENTRY COMMITTEE

Glen Echo's Reentry Committee met online to discuss procedures to return to worship in the sanctuary. This will occur when the number of new coronavirus cases declines for four consecutive weeks — and the rate of new infections in Polk County falls to 2%. On March 1st, Polk County had 11,925 positive tests per 100,000 people, which is 11.9%. (https://coronavirus.iowa.gov/pages/casecounts)

As the vaccine is distributed and the positivity rate falls, we will move into the Yellow Phase of our Reentry Plan. Some guidelines are listed below:

- 1. Members will be encouraged to come to church only if they are symptom-free, and thermometers will be available to take temperatures.
- 2. Masks will be required.
- 3. Ushers will seat and dismiss attendees to maintain safe distances between family groups.
- 4. Singing and responsive readings will be limited.
- 5. Folks are welcome to bring their own communion elements or pick up pre-packaged servings at the church.
- 6. Bulletins will be placed on designated pews where people sit.
- 7. Offerings can be put in plastic tubs located inside the building.
- 8. Attendees will need to exit the building immediately when the service ends.

We are seeking donations of the following supplies to help with cleaning when we reopen: Lysol spray, Clorox-type wipes, hand sanitizer, and masks. We will also need additional people to serve as greeters and ushers on Sunday mornings. Thank you, in advance, for your help!
