MINISTER'S MOMENT

I am extremely excited about the upcoming Lenten season that begins on Wednesday, March 2nd. Some of my favorite Lenten activities, such as Prayer Stations and in-person mid-week studies, were put on hiatus for two years as we implemented necessary precautions to keep us healthy. Conditions have improved to the point where in-person studies can resume and Prayer Stations can be placed in the sanctuary.



A picture of one of these stations is included in this article. Each week, a new Prayer Station will appear, and folks are invited to read the accompanying directions and add their petitions. The stations can be accessed during the week and on weekends, and folks are welcome to spend additional time at the church as they commune with God.

I am also excited about the devotional book that we will use during Lent, *Good Enough: 40ish Devotionals for a Life of Imperfection* by Dr. Kate Bowler (and Jessica Richie). Kate is a 41 year old wife and mother who finds meaning in life in spite of her Stage 4 cancer diagnosis. One of her poems is titled, "A Blessing for a Joyfully Mediocre Journey," and part of it is printed below:

"Blessed are you who are tired of pretending that raw effort is the secret to perfection. It's not. And you know that now.

"Blessed are you who need a gentle reminder that even now, even today, God is here, and somehow, that is good enough."

The last two years have demonstrated that many factors are beyond our control, and life is different than we had envisioned. My prayer for Lent is that we will discover, as Kate has, that God is here, and somehow, that is good enough.

PREPARING FOR LENT


Materials provided by Dr. Marcia McFee of Worship Design Studio, in conjunction with Duke Professor Dr. Kate Bowler (and Jessica Richie), will be used this year during Lent. We will build a *Good Enough* ladder garden in the sanctuary (*left*), which will encourage us to accept life's imperfections and bloom where we are planted. Weekly studies based upon the book (*below right*) will be held on Wednesdays. The inperson meetings will occur at Glen Echo at 10:00 AM beginning March 2nd, and the 7:30 PM Zoom meetings will commence on March 9th. Packets with study materials have been prepared for all who have signed up.

This year, we will share some of our Holy Week traditions with River Valley Disciples. Pastors and lay leaders from both congregations will plan and lead the 7:00 PM Maundy Thursday Service on April 14th. In keeping with our church's discernment that we are being led to partner with other congregations for Outreach projects, Joan and Pastor Dawn met with representatives of River Valley Disciples of February 17th to discuss joint Outreach ac

As was explained by Pastor Sheldon and RVD member, Deb, partnering with other ministries is one of River Valley Disciples' core values. We were able to find several projects in which both congregations can participate in the upcoming weeks and months.

After Glen Echo's worship service on Sunday, March 20th, GECC and RVD will make casseroles for the Salvation Army in the Fellowship Hall. 16 Sally Souffles will be made at the same time, as this is the maximum number that our ovens can hold. All are welcome to come to this time of shared mission and fellowship.

River Valley Disciples have a ministry called "Loads of Love," where they visit a local laundromat and offer

quarters to folks to cover the costs of washing clothes. One load of laundry can cost between \$8.00—\$10.00, which can be difficult for people with limited incomes. While the clothes get clean, RVD folks get to know the neighbors who come to the laundromat. Cookies and conversation are offered to all who would like to partake.

Glen Echo folks have been invited to participate in Loads of Love, either by donating quarters or by joining River Valley Disciples when they visit laundromats. We will collect quarters for the next washday that will occur at the start of April. Please add your .25 to the jar on the table in the church entryway.





Some Future Outreach Possibilities

Joan, Deb, Pastor Sheldon and Pastor Dawn discussed additional ideas during the productive meeting in February. Other ministry possibilities include distributing water during the Beaverdale Farmers Market, supplying suppers for families at the Ronald McDonald House, and cooking for approximately 25 folks who seek meals at the Catholic Worker House. (Eventually, we may be able to resume providing meals at the Central Iowa Shelter if there are enough strong backs and willing hands available in the two congregations.)
